

KNP Intervention Guide

Under **Resources**, choose **The KNP Intervention Guide**, log in and then choose **Search the Intervention Guide**.

Choose from a variety of ways to search the Intervention Guide

Standards—Choose the Domain, Cluster and then Standard to generate a list of activities that directly support that standard.

Fluency Benchmark— Choose the Fluency Benchmark for a comprehensive list of activities that work together to support that standard.

Task Group—Choose from a list of all of the Task Groups. This is a great option if you know the KNP number of the activity you wish to find.

Setting—Type in a key word to search for activities that use a particular setting or material.

Grade Level—Generate a list of activities to target a particular grade level standard.

Choose a **Search Type** to find an activity.

Choose an activity. Each activity has a unique KNP Number.

Decoding the KNP Task Number

The Letter indicates the Strand:

- Number Words and Numerals
 - [Nf] – Number words forward
 - [Nb] – Number words backward
 - [Ni] – Numeral ID
- [A] Addition and Subtraction
- [S] Structuring
- [M] Multiplication and Division
- [T] Base Ten Arithmetical Strategies

A 3321.6

The center 4 digits identify the Task Group.

The final number indicates the entry within the Task Group. The higher the task number, the more sophisticated the task.
